
and provides space for personal renewal of one's relationship to Jesus Christ.

Bearing the Chalice

The first time I served as a Chalice Bearer was in a huge Lutheran Church in Cary, NC. The church had about fifteen hundred members, and it was on Easter Sunday! As I walked down the aisle, I was shaking in my shoes. It looked like all fifteen hundred members and all their friends and relatives were there! I didn't know how I was going to do it, but it was too late to back out. I had to go through with it and depend on God to help me. I knew God tells us not to fear and promises to give us the words and the ability when they are needed.

I started out with shaking hands as they kept coming and coming to the altar by the hundreds, But as they kept coming I slowly became calm enough to think about what I was doing. On the very day we were celebrating the resurrection of Christ, I had been given the amazing honor and privilege of sharing with these people the very blood of our risen Lord! I knew for sure then – perhaps for the first time with such conviction – that Christ truly is present in the

elements of communion. And I realized that it was His presence that was calming my fear and giving me the ability to keep going. As we walked back down the aisle at the end of the service, I was no longer shaking. Instead I felt like I was floating!

That was many years ago, and there have been many Eucharists since then. Along the way I served as Chalice Bearer in a Catholic service at a retreat center and, of course, in the Episcopal Church. I doubt that there are many people who have been Chalice Bearer in Lutheran. Catholic, and Episcopal churches! But every time it is the same honor. Sometimes as Ray lifted the very shiny silver chalice we use at Trinity, I would see my reflection in it. I would be humbled and amazed that I - even I – was given the amazing privilege of serving the blood of Christ to his people.

What I am trying to say by telling this story about my own experience is that serving as Chalice Bearer is not a chore to be done, but a true honor and privilege. It is truly uplifting to be given that honor and to serve that role in the Eucharistic liturgy. I would gladly do it every Sunday except that sometimes we just can't make it because of bad weather or because we are out of town. And my legs are getting to the point that I just can't stand on them that long. I may need to pass the role to someone else and just be thankful that I was able to do it for so many years. But right now, there is no one to pass it to.

We have too few Chalice Bearers at Trinity, and we badly need some more. I stress again that it is not a chore but a highly rewarding privilege. You only need a little training and to be registered with the Diocese to serve. Please think about whether you are interested in serving. If so, let me or Sam know.
