The members of the prayer shawl ministry continue to make shawls and lap robes for those on our prayer list.





From information in the Parish Register of Trinity Episcopal Parish:

In early spring of 1896, the members of Trinity Mission moved forward with their decision to build an Episcopal church in Mount Airy. The church building was funded through "subscriptions" from people in the church and in the community. Other Dioceses in Virginia and North Carolina contributed to the building of the Mount Airy church. These subscriptions ranged from 50 cents to 100 dollars. Two concerts were held to raise money for the building, successfully raising \$21 and \$26 dollars. The building committee reported a proposed cost of \$1,747.18 for the lot, deed, and building. Granite for the church was donated. Following the building committee's report to the congregation of Trinity Mission, the building process began.

Denny Jennings is doing her good work on our Parish Registry. She pulled out these recollections which were recorded by Robert Merritt.

A Letter from Mother Lyn

October 30, 2018

Dear Trinity Friends,

It's about time I wrote to let you know what is happening in the deep South. It seems we have all had our share of hurricanes. Nothing came close to us in Hattiesburg. I think the weather is similar here and there; not as hot as I'd feared and we are already having some nights in the 40's. The house here is comfortable, near my daughter and a little bigger than the Dobson house, and it has a dining room that might be filled for Thanksgiving dinner. The first thing I did was put up a birdfeeder and fill some pots with flowering plants on the deck.

Our family continues to amaze. In addition to baby Brigg's arrival on July 31st (two days after we landed here) both my sons are expecting now too. Mike and Rachel are expecting a boy in February and Luca and Kelly are expecting in May. Odds are that one will be a girl but who knows. Eli turns 4 in December and is the cutest and sweetest big brother you can imagine. We are so glad and thankful to be here to enjoy things like Grandparents Day, picking them up early from "school" and babysitting some Saturdays to help out when Annie and Jordan are at work. It is truly a blessing to have this time together.

As for my health, I am still maintaining with chemo. I ration my energy, doing things I enjoy. Robert's care makes this possible as he does most chores like cooking and grocery shopping. Nothing has spread beyond the initial pancreas tumor and liver lesions. I am back on a high dose chemo but it is easier to tolerate than what I was getting this time last year. My appetite is good and energy gets better as days post chemo increase. I get the chemo every other week, so I have a good 10 days of feeling good and living life. I continue to also go to Mayo Clinic every three months for scans and consultation with the specialist there. So far so good. I apologize that I haven't responded to some cards and phone calls. I just need to focus on health and family now.


I bid your prayers for Robert, my family and of course my own healing. I know you are praying for me. Please pray for total healing, physical as well as emotional and spiritual healing. I know prayers are already being answered. I have had some amazing spiritual insights reflecting on my life journey with God and being near these babies certainly boosts my emotions. Physically, the cancer is not spreading so that is good. As time goes on I will need even more Divine intervention. I know God heals all things and His miracles are real. I try to believe one of those miracles is for me. But, it is hard to believe I am worthy of that. I need your help for this! Please pray for this miracle where I am weak. A cancer survivor told me the hardest thing for him was to "open myself to receive healing." It is a very vulnerable place to be, to put myself out there before God and ask him to heal my body... what if he doesn't? We all need to risk this disappointment, in many areas of life trusting that God's will is for us to prosper. God's will is for faith to grow and deepen. Proclaiming our faith is never a punishable sin.

Well, I've gone on awhile. I do miss being with you, we love you and hope your new priest is near. I know some of you are cancer survivors too. I am walking especially near you on this uncertain, yet strangely blessed, path.

Thanks be to God. May all that we do and say glorify His name.
